For nearly 55 years, Carteret Community College has been true to its mission to "improve the quality of life for all citizens of Carteret County and eastern North Carolina" by providing high quality teaching, training, support, and enrichment opportunities. To continue being a leader in education and partnership, the College must be responsive to the evolving needs and challenges of students, employers, and the community.

As we plan for the next half-century, Carteret Community College is excited to present the Building Our Future Together capital campaign. Phase 1 of the campaign will enhance the facilities, programs, and equipment for Culinary and Hospitality Arts, Aquaculture & Marine Trades, Health Sciences, STEM education, Career Center, and exterior campus improvements.

The College has secured over half of the total anticipated cost to reach these goals from the Carteret County Commissioners, NC Connect Bond Referendum (2015), Golden Leaf Foundation, Carteret Community College Foundation, and others. In addition to the funds already raised, we are seeking commitments totaling \$5,102,761 to complete the goals of Phase 1.




HOW WE PLAN TO REACH OUR \$5,102,761 GOAL

HOSPITALITY & CULINARY ARTS CENTER

The College has plans and state approval to build a new Culinary and Hospitality Arts Center that is designed to provide students a high level of education and training. The technology infrastructure will provide students a unique opportunity to learn and train on the best equipment in the industry by:

- Building a new 16,128 square-foot Culinary & Hospitality Arts Center.
- Incorporating state-of-the-art ovens, freezers and kitchen tools with advanced digital capabilities through touch screen and video technology.
- Including a 150-person seating capacity.

AQUACULTURE & MARINE TRADES

Carteret Community College is one of 12 community colleges across the United States that is being considered as a Domestic Maritime Center of Excellence through a new national initiative that will advance the capabilities of the College to secure the talent pipeline for maritime industry jobs by filling a void in training and educational programs. If approved, Carteret would be the only North Carolina Community College with this prestigious designation. The Center of Excellence Designation will allow Carteret Community College to expand its capacity the following ways:



- Train maritime workers by admitting more students and developing the Marine Science and Technology Early College.
- Train faculty in maritime professional development.
- Expand facilities to incorporate new, advanced and state-of-the-art equipment.
- Create new maritime career pathways from associate degree to baccalaureate degree programs.



To better position the College to become designated as a center, remodeling and upgrade in equipment is crucial. This will also help meet the teaching and learning needs of today's students in the current Marine Trades programs. In 2018, the College began a new program in Marine Diesel Technology focused on heavy equipment and marine diesel engines. **Building Our Future Together** means Carteret Community College will become the premier workforce leader in North Carolina when designated as a Maritime Center of Excellence.

To provide quality STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math) programming, updated equipment is needed to meet the needs of today's students. The purchase of new information technology, 3D Printing and Computing Technology equipment will help encourage students to attend the College by:


- Enhancing student-faculty collaborative learning environments.

- Supporting STEM courses that serve as the framework for academic programs.



Replacing the aging infrastructure with modern equipment and technology will provide an opportunity for students to experience more applied science programs, such as aquaculture, marine trades, diesel technology, boat manufacturing, and marine trades. **Building Our Future Together** means new chemistry, engineering, and computing equipment at the College.

HEALTH SCIENCES SIMULATION EQUIPMENT



Carteret Community College is the leading provider for training health care professionals in Carteret County. Health care simulation for improved training of the future and current work force is critical, and even expected, in these education programs. The purchase of new Health Care Simulation Equipment is necessary to continue to meet the needs of students pursuing a career in the health care industry. With excellent health science faculty, the College offers career programs in **Nursing, Respiratory Therapy, Medical Assisting, Emergency Medical Science (EMS), and Radiography Technology**.



The College will recapture and renovate space on campus to incorporate this equipment.

- Technology and seating renovation for the Bryant Student Center (outdoor student patio).
- One-mile loop walking/biking shoreline educational trail.
- Round-about and new traffic patterns.

- Digital marquee and new signage with Civic Center.
- Addition of a new Career Center
