The Cosmetology Instructor curriculum provides a course of study for learning the skills needed to teach the theory and practice of cosmetology as required by the North Carolina Board of Cosmetic Arts.

Course work includes requirements for becoming an instructor, introduction to teaching theory, methods and aids, practice teaching, and development of evaluation instruments.

Graduates of the program may be employed as cosmetology instructors in public or private education and business.

The program prepares the cosmetology teacher trainee with the knowledge and skills to be effective in classroom and practical instructional settings. Cosmetology instructors teach coursework related to hygiene, sanitation, hair, nail, and skin services at a vocational school or college. Duties include creating lesson plans that involve both theory and practical work, designing hands-on activities, monitoring progress, and grading assignments. Instructors help students explore opportunities in the field of esthetics and earn the qualifications and skills they need to pursue a career. Responsibilities also include communicating effectively with diverse personalities and learning styles, building and maintaining effective relationships with students, and demonstrating the necessary professionalism and adherence to ethical standards.
